

Does your dog have:

Osteoarthritis? Mobility Problems? Limping?

NC State University College of Veterinary Medicine is looking for dogs who show signs of osteoarthritis. The goal of this clinical trial is to evaluate the benefits of a novel study drug to control pain associated with osteoarthritis in dogs.



PARTICIPATION

- Patients will be given 1 dose of the drug.
- Owners will be required to come to NCSU with their dog for a total of 6 study visits over the course of 3-4 months. Owners must comply with all study visits and be willing to complete questionnaires and follow-up telephone calls.
- Patients will need to wear an extra collar with an activity sensor attached.

STUDY BENEFITS

- **FULLY-FUNDED.** This includes radiographs, orthopedic exams, and lab work.

INCLUSION & EXCLUSION CRITERIA - In order to participate, your dog:

- Must have clinical signs of osteoarthritis
- Must be at least 6 months of age and weigh >7.5 kg (16.5 lbs)
- Must be in general good health or with stabilized chronic conditions
- Cannot currently (i.e., within the last month) be on any NSAIDs or steroids (e.g. carprofen, firocoxib, grapiprant, prednisone) but may remain on gabapentin, amantadine, and any joint supplements.
