

# Does your dog suffer from Atopic Dermatitis?

**NC State Dermatology** is looking for dogs that have non-seasonal Atopic Dermatitis for a trial to investigate a novel immunotherapy drug. The goal is to greatly reduce or eliminate the sensitivity to this allergen thus improving the dog's quality of life.

## PARTICIPATION

- Patients will be required to come to NCSU for 10 study visits over the course of 24 weeks.
- Owners must closely monitor their dog at home and record in an Owner Diary.



**This study is FULLY FUNDED, including:** physical exams, Allergen-specific tests, bloodwork and urinalysis, and 4 doses of the injectable immunotherapy drug.

## INCLUSION CRITERIA

- Must have NON-SEASONAL atopic dermatitis from the house dust mite allergen (allergen-specific testing done at NCSU)
- Food allergies must be ruled out with a proper, at least 6 week, elimination diet trial
- Must be on flea prevention for at least 12 weeks before study and for duration of study.
