

Does your cat have a history of chronic gastrointestinal disease?

NC State College of Veterinary Medicine is leading this clinical trial looking into radiation therapy for the treatment of lymphocytic lymphoma/inflammatory bowel disease complex (FLL/IBD) in cats. This therapy could potentially reduce clinical symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea, and inability to gain weight.

PARTICIPATION

- Recruited participants will be required to come to NCSU-CVM for treatment.
 Owners must be compliant with study visits, and you must be willing to complete questionnaires. Total participation lasts about 1 year with 4-5 study visits.
- Your cat will undergo 4 consecutive days of radiation therapy at NCSU. You may pick up your cat each evening or they may stay here during their treatment.

INCLUSION CRITERIA

- Must have a history of chronic GI disease and/or a diagnosis of FLL/IBD.
- Cannot have any other major illnesses affecting their lifespan or ability to undergo anesthesia.
- Cannot have been treated with steroids or chemotherapy.
- Cannot have participated in a hypoallergenic diet trial within the past thirty days.

STUDY BENEFITS - FULLY FUNDED CLINICAL TRIAL

- All study related procedures and treatments are covered (approximately \$8,000)
 - o Including exams, bloodwork, radiation therapy, and hospitalization
