## Now Enrolling Dogs with Oral Melanoma

NC State University Veterinary Hospital is looking for dogs with stage I or II with oral melanoma for a clinical trial using a new therapeutic drug (GM-1111) and standard of care radiotherapy.

The purpose of this clinical trial is to evaluate whether the novel therapy has:

- 1. Direct anti-cancer activity,
- 2. Capacity to enhance the effectiveness of radiation therapy in the tumor, and
- 3. Ability to protect against side effects of radiation therapy.

The clinical trial will also collect safety data.

## Inclusion Criteria:

- Weigh more than 3 kilograms (6.6 pounds).
- Histopathologic diagnosis of oral malignant melanoma.
- MUST have an oral tumor (< 4 cm diameter)</li> present at enrollment.
- No metastatic disease.
- Owners must be willing to give an injection under the skin, once daily for 6 weeks.
- Radiation therapy is given as four onceweekly treatments.

All dogs will receive drug & radiotherapy, free of charge.
